Do you offer Intensive Language courses specially for exchange students?	ESL courses are offered at all levels through CAPS (College of Advanced & Professional Studies) but the courses are not covered under the tuition waiver. https://www.umb.edu/academics/caps/esl
Eligibility (qualifications/restrictions)	Students must be nominated by the home university; attended at least one year on the home campus; be in good academic standing; and meet language requirements.
Workload	Minimum 12 US credits per semester (usually 4 courses, 3 credit per course) for undergraduates, and 9 credits (3 courses) for graduate students.
Academic Program and Courses	<p>The students are eligible to participate in all programs except Nursing and CAPS (College of Advanced & Professional Studies). Courses in clinical Psychology are not open for non-degree students. There are no programs created specifically for exchange students.</p> <p>Some courses are only open to matriculated degree students.</p> <p>College of Management: Limited courses open for non-degree registration. Please review their registration policies for non-degree students. Due to the nature of the programs within the College of Management (CM), students face difficulty in transferring prerequisites from their home institution and there is a very limited number of seats open in most of the CM courses. Students should plan on taking courses outside of the College of Management if, for whatever reason, they cannot get enrolled into the CM courses.</p> <p>Check course catalog for current semester course offerings: https://www.umb.edu/academics/course_catalog</p>
Application Procedure	<p>Complete exchange student application form and supporting documentation.</p> <p>For application and guidelines, check the website: https://www.umb.edu/academics/global/exchange/incoming_exchange_students</p> <p>Supporting documentation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An official transcript(s), in English, of courses previously completed • Minimum TOEFL score of 79-80 (Internet-Based) or 213 (Computer-Based) for both Undergraduate and Graduate students • A Professor's academic recommendation • A 200 word essay explaining the reasons for studying at UMass Boston • Evidence of funding (\$1,500 per month X number of months of intended stay at UMass Boston) in the form of a scholarship award letter, or personal bank statement, or an affidavit of support from parents/sponsor accompanied by evidence of that individual's ability to finance your studies

Application Deadlines	<p>Full academic year (Sept. to May) - March 1</p> <p>Fall semester only (Sept. to December) - April 1</p> <p>Spring semester only - October 1 *Spring 2020 extended to October 15</p>
When Acceptance Packages will be sent?	<p>Acceptance letters will be sent approximately one month after application deadline.</p> <p>https://www.umb.edu/academics/global/exchange/incoming_exchange_students</p>
Visa	<p>Form DS2019 (hard copy) will be sent to the accepted students via FedEx to apply for a visa in the local U.S.A consulate. Students will enter the U.S. on a J-1 student visa (non-degree seeking).</p>
Health Insurance	<p>Students are required to have insurance coverage that is considered comparable to the insurance that the U.S. Department of State requires for J-1 visa holders. Students may purchase the University of Massachusetts Boston student insurance, or from the other carrier that meets the required standards.</p>
University Fees	<p>The mandatory student fees are approximately \$800 per semester for an undergraduate student and approximately \$700 per semester for a graduate student. These fees are subject to change and might increase. These fees cannot be waived as there are not included in tuition and academic fees waiver and are to be paid upon student's registration to UMass Boston.</p>
Numbers of exchange students	<p>According to each specific student exchange agreement with a partner university; in total approximately 50 incoming exchange students per semester.</p>
Estimate of Living Expenses per month	<p>\$1,500 USD per month</p>
Average temperature (Summer/ Winter)	<p>Fall semester - daily mean: 22 °C high to -2 °C low</p> <p>Spring semester -daily mean: -2 °C low up to 23 °C high</p>
Housing	<p>A residence hall (dormitory) opened on Campus in Fall 2018. A limited number of spots will be available for exchange students but in <u>spring semester only</u>. There is cafeteria in the dorm; There are two cafeterias on Campus, open for breakfast and lunch (Monday through Friday). UMass Boston has agreements with local private housing complexes (Harbor Point and the Peninsula) in addition to recommendation for the private rooms to rent in the vicinity of the Campus. https://www.umb.edu/housing/off_campus</p>
