Visa	Form DS2019 (hard copy) will be sent to the accepted students via FedEX to apply for a visa in
	the local U.S.A consulate. Students will enter the U.S. on a J-1 student visa (non-degree
	seeking).
Health Insurance	Students are required to have insurance coverage that is considered comparable to the
	insurance that the U.S. Department of State requires for J-1 visa holders. Students may
	purchase the University of Massachusetts Boston student insurance, or from the other carrier
	that meets the required standards.
University Fees	The mandatory student fees are approximately \$800 per semester for an undergraduate
	student and approximately \$700 per semester for a graduate student. These fees are subject to
	change and might increase. These fees cannot be waived as there are not included in tuition
	and academic fees waiver and are to be paid upon student's registration to UMass Boston.
