

Enrolments Fact Sheet – Spring 2021/22

January bidding period

1. OVERVIEW OF THE BIDDING AND ADD-DROP PERIODS

The Bidding Platform supports the enrolment process for master's students at Nova SBE. The enrolments for each semester start with one or two bidding periods, followed by two Add/drop periods during the first week of each trimester classes, where students have the opportunity to add and drop classes provided there are available seats.

The Bidding system was designed in a way that students do not need to rush their bids. **This is not a first come/first served process, so there is no advantage in enrolling early and no guarantee that students will be enrolled in all their requested courses or modules.** Nevertheless, it is not advisable to leave it to the last hours, as it may take some time to get acquainted with the bidding platform and place your bids successfully.

Only students who are officially enrolled will obtain a grade at the end of the term. **No changes** will be accepted after the after each enrolment period. Students who do not carry out their courses, nor comply with course assessments including exams, will see their course status as a Fail. **This will appear on the final transcript.**

It is essential that students consult the "Enrolments – The Guide" and "Enrolments – a Closer Look" for key details on the bidding and add/drop processes, requirements per program or courses and other information.

2. BIDDING PERIOD GENERAL INFORMATION

Offer notices:

- Economics students must choose between Macroeconometrics or Microeconometrics as their mandatory course. Students who wish to enrol in both courses (select the second one as an elective) must wait to bid in the add/drop period in case there are remaining slots
- Excel module is available for enrolment in a separate process. Students who do not register
 for Excel in the Spring can opt to taking it in the next semester Fall 22/23.
- Language courses will be available for enrolment in a separate process, outside the bidding platform.
- 2620 Special Project L'Oreal Brandstorm Competition will be available for registration in a separate process. Applying students should select course 20008 Special Course: L'Oreal Brandstorm Competition (Notice of Intention to Apply) on the Bidding Platform.  Professional Development Modules will be available also on later add/drops for all regular Masters and and Double Degree students.

2.3 Add/drop period
